
#### **Financial Arrangements**

- When registering you will need to provide your current medical insurance or Medicare information. We will submit your insurance claim for you.
- If you have insurance, you will need to pay the co-insurance and deductible amounts.
- If you do not have medical insurance, payment can be made by check, money order or credit card. Please do not bring cash as a form of payment for your procedure.
- You will be billed separately for diagnostic testing, your surgeon's fees and fees associated with anesthesiology, radiology and/or pathology involved with your procedure.


## WHY CHOOSE AN OUTPATIENT SURGERY CENTER

The following instructions will help you to get ready for your upcoming surgery. Please contact the Belmont/Harlem Surgery Center at (773) 889-2000 if you have any questions or concerns.

### **Pre-operative information**

- Our nurse will contact you 24-48 hours before your surgery to confirm your scheduled time as well as to remind you of pre-operative instructions. If you do not receive a message from our nurse 24 hours before your scheduled appointment, please contact us at (773) 889-2000 to confirm.
- Our guidelines require that you receive written and verbal instructions about your patient rights and responsibilities, Advanced Directives and financial interest at least 24 hours prior to your surgery date.
- Pre-operative laboratory tests may be required.
   If these tests are required, please forward your results to the Center at least three days prior to your scheduled surgery.
- If you experience symptoms of illness during the two days prior to surgery, please contact your surgeon to discuss.

- DO NOT eat or drink anything, including water, after midnight (12 a.m.) on the day of surgery, unless otherwise directed by your surgeon.
- Plan to arrive at least one hour before your scheduled procedure.
- Make arrangements for a responsible adult to remain with you at the Surgery Center and take you home. The presence of a designated adult driver is required for post-operative transportation and should remain in the Surgery Center during your procedure.
- Parents of minors must remain in the waiting room during their child's surgery.

## **Preparing for your procedure**

- · Leave all valuables at home.
- · Remove all make-up and jewelry.
- · Wear loose-fitting, comfortable clothing.
- You should bathe or shower the morning of your surgery. Brush your teeth but do not swallow the water used to rinse your mouth.
- · Bring a list of medications you take regularly.

### **Upon arrival**

- Check in at the registration desk.
   Please be sure to bring your insurance card, a photo ID and any requested forms.
- You will be escorted to an area to change into a surgery gown and any necessary pre-operative testing will be completed.
- You will be asked to remove contact lenses, hearing aids and dentures.
- An anesthesiologist will consult with you prior to your procedure.

#### **After your procedure**

- You will be taken to the Post-Anesthesia Care Unit, where trained nurses will monitor your vital signs until you are allowed to return home.
- Before you are discharged, you will be served a light snack.
- Our nurse will personally review your postoperative instructions with you.

## Post-operative follow up

- Our recovery staff will contact you within 24-72 hours following your procedure.
   If you have any questions prior to that call, we ask that you contact your physician.
- It is important for you to follow your physician's instructions regarding diet, medications, bathing, driving and activity. Contact your physician if you experience complications.
- We encourage you to eat lightly and to avoid high fat foods for the first 24 hours after your procedure.
